Allen School of Health Sciences Policies and Procedures for Awarding Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students from the Higher Education Relief Fund (HE-ERF) under the CARES Act

Allen School has earmarked \$1,384,693 in grant money to distribute to eligible students. The following student population may be eligible for grants:

- Students who were active on March 13<sup>th</sup>, 2020 (when a national emergency was declared) will have a disbursement of \$900 each processed during the week of 5/25/2020 if they meet the following criteria:
  - 1. Students must be currently active (active, probation, LOA, internship)
  - 2. Students must be in the Medical Assistant program
  - 3. Student must have required POG documentation on file
  - 4. Students must sign and return attached request form demonstrating that they have incurred expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus
  - Students must sign and return attached acceptance form certifying that they have provided truthful information
  - 5. Students must have completed a FAFSA that shows that they are eligible to receive Title IV funds
- Subsequent disbursements will be triggered at two points in the program- currently active students at the end of module 1 classes and currently active students at the end of module 4 classes
- Subsequent disbursements will be processed each new module until the grant money is depleted
  - For these subsequent disbursements, students must meet criteria 1-6 above
- Students will most likely receive no more than two distributions total (unless there is money left over once all eligible students receive two disbursements)
- Each distribution will be for \$900 per student until the grant money runs out
  - Final distribution date will be the remainder of the grant money available divided evenly among eligible students
